





2014 REVENUES





Since 2008, GOAL has awarded scholarships to more than 9,000 deserving Georgia children. With the 2015-16 scholarship season underway, total GOAL scholarships awarded to date is \$73.5 million, with another \$27 million earmarked for providing additional scholarship awards for current and future academic years to parents who choose to send their children to qualified private pre-k-12 schools.



ERICA GODBEHERE




